

Recipe Book

A fun and clean way to keep your recipes. You can clean the cards if you spill on them. With the ribbon it is easy to add or remove recipes. You can even display it on the kitchen counter. This would also make a great Bridal shower gift, including all of the recipes that the guests want to share!)

Supplies:

- Purple Cows Hot Laminator #3020
- Purple Cows Laminator Sheets 12" x 12" #4050
- Purple Cows Laminator scraps
- Purple Cows Laminator Sheets 8" x 8" #4030
- Purple Cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer Straight Edge #1041
- Purple Cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer Scoring Blade #1043
- Paper is Bohemia Blossom "Girl" Floral Light Pink
- Coordinating paper is Bohemia "Birthday" Stripe Light Pink
- Eyelet and eyelet setter (you will need many eyelets)
- Ribbon
- Adhesive
- All of your recipe cards



1. Cut paper into a 6.5" wide strip, then cut a piece of paper into a 1.5" x 6.5" strip for binding
2. Measure binding strip about 5.25" from outside edge to the center on back, then glue binding onto back of paper
3. Purple Cow Hot Laminate in 12" x 12" # 4050 sheet (you can trim and save the scraps for something else before you laminate)
4. Trim edges with the Purple Cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer Straight edge #1041
5. Use the Purple Cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer Scoring Blade #1043 Score binding edge on book.
6. Put 2 eyelets on the back and 2 eyelets on the Binding (1" in from edge). Set Eyelets

7. Use the Paper that you have left to back your recipe cards (my cards are 4" x 6" so I cut them at 5" x 6")
8. Attach recipe card to backing paper
9. Use Purple Cows Hot Laminator #3020 with 8"x 8" #4030 laminating paper
10. Trim with Purple cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer Straight Edge #1041
11. Set eyelets on the recipe cards
12. Make a label (write "recipe" on it)
13. Make a back panel with the scraps cut it at 2.75" x 1". Attach label to back panel
15. Use Purple Cows Hot Laminator #3020 to laminate the recipe label with a scrap piece of laminating paper
16. Trim with Purple Cows 2 in 1 Combo Trimmer blade #1041, attach to front of book with eyelet setter
17. Weave Ribbon through the eyelets on the binding and back of book, then, weave one recipe card at a time into the book
18. Tie a bow then you are done.
