

Reversible Magazine Necklace by Cecilly Hart

This necklace will be totally unique from anything out there and it can fit your personality. One tip I might suggest, use magazine pages that contain bright graphic prints, images, and interesting designs for a more dynamic appeal.

Supplies:

- Pkg. of Blue Moon® Lrg. Wide Curb Chain 80"
- 6 Blue Moon® Jump Rings
- Scotch® Glue Stick
- 5 Eyelets (I used Crop-A-Dile)
- Eyelet Setter (Crop-A-Dile)
- Purple Cows® Hot Laminator
- Purple Cows® 5" x 5" Hot Laminator Pocket
- Purple Cows® Easy Trimmer
- Magazine and Paper Clippings



1. Cut 4 1"x 1" squares from magazine/paper scrap
2. Cut 1 3"x 1" rectangles from magazine/paper scrap
3. Cut 2 3" x 3" squares from magazine/paper scrap
4. Glue two of the small squares back to back
5. Continue with the remaining coordinating sizes/pairs
6. There should now be 5 pieces. One large square, 2 rectangles, and 2 small squares.
7. Put all pieces in laminator pocket and send through the laminator
8. Cut all pieces out leaving a scant 1/8" border around all sides
9. Set an eyelet a 1/8" from the edge, centered at the top of each piece
10. Attach jump rings, which you do by slightly pulling the ring ends away from each other and then pushing them back together when fully on
11. Measure and cut chain to a desired length, preferably long enough to get over your head easily
12. With a jump ring, link both ends of the chain together, forming a necklace
13. Attach largest square to the jump ring that linked both ends of the chain
14. Be sure to be thinking about symmetry when doing this part of the project
15. About 2"-3" from the center, attach the 2 rectangles, one on each side
16. Starting at the rectangles, measure 2"-3" up and attach the smallest and final squares, one on each side
17. The final should look symmetrical
18. Congrats! You have now made the most killer necklace ever!
